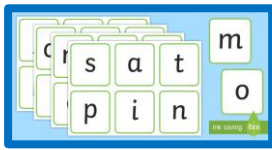


Crocodile in the river

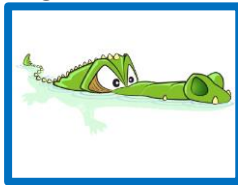
You will need:

- A4 letter sound cards, for example, the letter 's'
- Large piece of blue fabric



Taking it forward:

Make the river wider and the words longer.



What's in it for the children?

The children are given the opportunity to apply their phonic knowledge to recognition of sounds, blending and segmenting.

What to do:

Lay the fabric on the floor like a river (if you are playing the game outside then you can use chalk instead).

Tell the children they have to cross the river, but a crocodile lives in it.

Assume the role of the crocodile and stand in the river.

The only way for the children to cross safely is for them to make a bridge.

They must make a bridge by laying three cards across the fabric to form a three letter word as a bridge.
